COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS CITY OF STACYVILLE

Mayor Paul Halbach called the regular December meeting of the Stacyville City Council to order at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, December 14, 2020, with council members Jake Gerbig, Roger Hemann, and Roger Brumm present. Absent was Allyn Brumm and Jason Hanson. The Mayor then welcomed all guests and called for approval of the meeting agenda. Gerbig moved to accept the agenda seconded by R. Brumm and carried. R. Brumm moved and Hemann seconded to approve the minutes. All voted aye.

The contractor will resume and finish the water project next spring. Hemann moved and Gerbig seconded to approve pay request number two payable to Popp Excavating for \$209,882.58. All voted aye. Rustin told the council that there are 16 households that have not been inspected or corrected their sump pump discharge. SEH will put a binder together for the City summarizing the inspections.

Joe Erbe reported that the smoke testing has been completed. There was smoke coming out of two foundations, one vacant lot and one manhole. The owners of the two houses will be notified that they need to correct their tile lines that are illegally connected to the City sewer system.

The culvert replacement on College Street will be done this fall. There will be a portion of College Street left at its current height so that water can go over the road during high flow.

Hemann moved and R. Brumm seconded by RESOLUTION 2020-16 TO PROVIDE FOR THE REDUCTION OF THE INTEREST RATE ON A SEWER REVENUE BOND FROM 3.00% TO 1.75%. All voted aye.

Work is progressing on the installation of the generators at the Community Center and Water Plant. Chuck Koenigs is the electrician doing the work. The work should be done this month.

Omnitel will be replacing their current phone lines with fiber optic starting in the Spring of 2021. Every residence and business will have the fiber run to their building. The City will be getting \$10,422.08 grant to help pay for the Covid19 related expenses.
