Brumm seconded by RESOLUTION 2021-1 TO APPROVE THE BUDGET MAXIMUM LEVY OF 10.14160. BY ROLL CALL ALL VOTED AYE.

The clerk reviewed with the council the upcoming budget numbers. Hemann moved and A. Brumm seconded to set the Public Hearing for the City 2021-2022 City Budget for March 8, 2021 at 7:00 PM at the Stacyville Public Library. All voted aye.

Joe Erbe, the Public Works Director asked the council get a City internet and phone service and to have his computer upgraded. A. Brumm moved and R. Brumm seconded to get the internet and phone service and upgrade. All voted aye.
